

Amish Finger Lakes NY – One Day Travel Itinerary

This simple day itinerary helps you explore Amish culture in the Finger Lakes, New York. It's built for travelers who want authentic experiences—local markets, scenic drives, and homemade foods.

Morning – Markets & Fresh Starts

- Start in Penn Yan – Visit The Windmill Farm & Craft Market (fresh produce, quilts, baked goods).
- Grab a shoofly pie or pretzel for breakfast.
- Talk to vendors – many Amish families sell directly here.

Midday – Scenic Drives & Roadside Finds

- Drive County Route 36 – rolling hills, farm views, especially stunning in fall.
- Stop at a roadside stand – buy jams, eggs, or handmade crafts (cash only).
- Picnic lunch along Keuka Lake – enjoy simple farm-to-table food.

Afternoon – Auctions & Hidden Spots

- Head to Seneca Produce Auction in Romulus – watch Amish farmers auction off crates of produce.
- Explore Dundee – find homemade bread, butter, and local crafts.

Evening – Slow Down & Reflect

- Take West Bluff Drive – lake views, farms, and sunset photo spots.
- Dinner in Penn Yan or Geneva – try farm-to-table restaurants sourcing Amish goods.

Traveler Tips

- Bring small bills – most stands do not accept cards.
- Respect privacy – avoid photographing Amish people directly.
- Drive slowly – horse-drawn buggies share the road.
- Sundays are quiet – most Amish businesses are closed.
